The Rev. James David Audlin (Distant Eagle) is an ordained UCC clergyperson and of Mohawk heritage. He is living in the Catskills target of multiple casinos after moving from CT where he saw the effects of the two tribal casinos.

Alicia Hansen is the staff writer and publications manager at the Tax Foundation. Her work on tax issues has appeared in major newspapers, including the Charlotte Observer

Bradley Beecher, former Commander of the Casino Licensing and Operations Unit for the CT State Police, also has expertise in racino and pari-mutuel gaming regulation plus fraud prevention and detection.

John W. Kindt is one of nation's most published experts on legalized gambling. His research in the areas of the economic impacts of legalized gambling have been published in many law review journals.
